



## Dress Code & Standards

The Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers is a traditional members' Club where smart attire is expected at all times. As one of the oldest and finest golf clubs in Scotland, we ask members, their guests and visitors to adhere to the following standards so that everyone may enjoy "The Muirfield Experience".

The Dress Code as outlined below cannot hope to cover all circumstances but the overriding principles are "smart attire and high standards at all times"

### On the Course

Players on the course are expected to maintain a high standard of dress and are required to wear smart golfing attire with spike, dimple or textured soled golf shoes.

- All trousers must be tailored, with no external pockets
- All shirts must have collars or polo necks and be worn tucked inside trousers or shorts
- The wearing of tailored shorts, with no external pockets, is permitted with long socks preferred, or socks that cover the ankle.
- Ladies are required to wear conventional golf attire.
- Players are politely reminded not to wear any of the following:
  - Jeans, tracksuits, shell suits
  - Vests, T-shirts, hooded sweaters, rugby or football shirts

### In the Clubhouse

- No headwear permitted

#### Before 10.30am:

- You can arrive in golf attire, however golf shoes or outer golf apparel are not permitted in any of the Club's public rooms.

#### After 10.30am:

- *For Men* – jacket and tie must be worn in all public rooms.
- *For Women* – a jacket or sleeved dress must be worn in all public rooms.
- Smart shoes, no shorts, jeans, trainers or sports shoes.

### Use of Mobile Devices

The use of mobile/cell-phone communication is not permitted after entry to Muirfield through the Club's gates. This includes inside the Clubhouse, on the Golf Course or within the Club's grounds.

A mobile device may be used to take a picture or enter a score on the Golf Course or very briefly check your diary in the Clubhouse.
